## TIPS for Writing a Good Grant Application

## General TIPS:

Before you start:

- Read the guidelines.
- Ensure your project planning is complete.
- If unsure about anything seek help.

Developing your Submission:

- Address the program's criteria and priorities; show how your project offers value for investment.
- Demonstrate the need and community benefit of your project.
- Provide realistic timeframes.
- Provide evidence of community support.
- Explain your project fully; don't leave room for questions.
- Provide a realistic and balanced budget.
- Complete all sections of application.
- Provide evidence of budget costings

## Language:

- Be concise, don't waffle.
- Don't use 'big' words for the sake of using a big word.
- Write positively 'when' not 'if', 'will' not 'could'.
- Don't write emotively, use factual statements.
